School Major Grant

Math Lab at Whisconier Middle School

A major grant has been awarded to Whisconier Middle School for a math lab and math coaching tools. Championed by WMS Math Coaches, Jim Fitzpatrick and Caitlin Cincotti, the technology awarded will be used as an educational tool offering students more individualized instruction, which will allow them to learn at their own pace and also help students stay focused. The grant also provides for standing desks in the lab. Research has shown that standing desks can help students be more engaged, enhance their creativity and improve educational scores.

Interpretive Signs for the Brookfield Still River Greenway Project

The Brookfield Education Foundation has awarded a major grant for the creation of four environmental signs for Brookfield's Still River Greenway Walkway. Brookfield Parks and Recreation and Conservation Commission will work with the Northwest Conservation District to create these self-guiding signs, which will help community members of all ages learn about the historic, geological and environmental features of the Still River.

School Major Grant
Climbing Wall at
Center Elementary School

A major grant from the Brookfield Education Foundation has allowed for the provision of a traverse climbing wall for Center Elementary School. Championed by Physical Education teacher, Joe Genovese, the project will focus on improving students' physical fitness, strength, confidence, listening skills, and communication skills. Brain-based learning through physical activity will also be emphasized via collaboration with classroom teachers, providing opportunities to integrate classroom activities in a fun, innovative manner.

Community Major Grant
Mobile Makerspace at the Brookfield Library

The Brookfield Education Foundation has awarded a major grant to the Brookfield Library for the creation of a Mobile Makerspace. The grant will allow for the provision of a 3D printer, a computerized sewing machine, a Dell Inspiron PC laptop, a MacBook Pro laptop, and 6 Arduino starter kits. The Makerspace will expose the community to new technologies, foster project collaboration and participatory learning, supplement small businesses, and promote STEAM education. The library will be holding classes and programs to teach adults, teens and kids how to use the equipment, positioning the library to act as a community center for people to gather, learn and work together.

School Mini-Grant
Breakout EDU at Whisconier
Middle School

The Brookfield Education Foundation has awarded a mini-grant to Whisconier Middle School for the innovative "Breakout EDU". Championed by media specialist, Sue Crean, this program combines problem solving with teamwork and technology by requiring students to gather information and decode puzzles in order to find combinations to locks and open a box within the allotted time. Breakout EDU will be implemented in the 21st Century Skills classes and made available to all WMS teachers for use in their classrooms.

School Major-Grant
Sea Perch Club at
Brookfield High School

A major grant from the Brookfield Education Foundation is providing an interactive opportunity for students interested in STEM fields by supporting the formation of a Sea Perch Club at Brookfield High School. Championed by three senior students, the Sea Perch program introduces students to basic engineering and physics principles through an underwater robotics competition. The grant will fund the robot kits necessary for the program, allowing Sea Perch to continue as a club available for competitive, STEM-minded students at the high school.

School Major-Grant
Music & Mentors
at Whisconier Middle School

This grant, championed by special education teacher, Nicole Forstrom, will provide a mentor structured program incorporating music, movement and social interaction between students. Special needs students at WMS will have the opportunity to learn from other students in areas such as following directions, imitating motor/hand sign movements, and following a rhythm just to name a few. In addition, this program will help spread acceptance and awareness into the Brookfield community and beyond.
