

School Major Grant Tower Gardens at Whisconier Middle School

Championed by science teachers, Linda Bertozzi and Dennis Petrino, the goal is for students to be involved in year round growth of fruits and vegetables. Science teachers in 5th, 6th and 8th grades will utilize this innovative growth system for educational lessons and hands on learning by students.

- 4. Include detailed pricing information as well as multiple quotes.
- 5. Provide any quantitative measures for the education element of the grant.
- 6. Email your grant request to the BEF.
- 7. Once received, the grant will be discussed at the next BEF meeting. Meetings take place on the first Tuesday of every month (except July).
- 8. If approved, be willing to share outcomes with the BEF. What worked? What didn't work?

Types of BEF Grants

<u>Major Grant</u> Grant request of \$500 or more

<u>Mini-Grants</u> Grant request less than \$500
